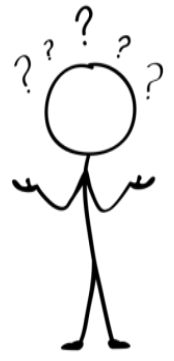
Evaluate a real example of a student involved in service-learning and how it was beneficial academically, professionally, socially and was personally satisfying.
